Bullying Definition Within St Brigid's Primary School, we have spent the first half term discussing and agreeing with pupils and staff our rules and procedures to promote positive behaviour. It is extremely rewarding for a school to be able to report that the majority of our children fully abide by the rules and procedures which ensure a safe and happy learning environment for everyone. As a school we are legally required to have and implement an Anti-Bullying Policy. This month we will be reviewing our policy with pupils, staff, parents and governors.

The Legal Definition of Bullying For Northern Ireland As Outlined In The 2016 Act is;

"(1) In this Act "bullying" includes (but is not limited to) the repeated use of -

a) Any verbal, written or electronic communication

b) Any other act, or

c) Any combination of those,

by a pupil or group of pupils against another pupil or group of pupils, with the **intention** of causing physical or emotional **harm** to that pupil or group of pupils.

We will be trying to reframe our language, so we are identifying the behaviour that we wish to see changed.

<u>Don't</u>

Refer to the pupil e.g. they are bullying

Refer to a pupil as the 'bully'

<u>Do</u>

Refer to the **behaviour** e.g. is it bullying behaviour

Refer to the 'Pupil/pupils displaying bullying behaviour'

Attendance & Punctuality Reminders

If your child is absent for any reason a note must be sent into the class teacher, giving a reason for the absence, on their return. This is for the Education Welfare Service. Thank you to all those who already do so. Lateness is also monitored by the Education Welfare Officer so please endeavour to get your child into school before the 8.55am bell. Just before the Halloween Break 151 children received certificates for 100% attendance. We appreciate that all children get sick from time to time but regular attendance at school gives children the best life chances.

So please encourage your child to attend punctually every-day!

<u>Please bring a coat to school</u>

Even though the weather has been relatively mild it can still be cold in our Playground. Please ensure your child brings a coat with them to school during the winter months. **Remember label all belongings**!
