# Primary 1 Enrolment

# After School Clubs

Recommence Monday 13<sup>th</sup> January. Notification of clubs will be sent home during the week of 6<sup>th</sup> January. <u>Our S'cool Club offers childcare to parents</u> <u>from 2.00-5.00pm every day.</u>

### Breakfast Club

Breakfast club runs every morning from 8.15 am - 8.45 am to facilitate parents who need to drop children off before 8.40am. If your child is having a breakfast the cost is £1. If your child does not wish to have breakfast but needs supervised before 8.40am the cost is 50p. (This is an extremely cheap childcare facility.) Children who receive Free School Meals still receive breakfast at no cost.

### Primary 7 Post Primary Transfer Interviews

We are currently preparing for P7 Transfer meetings. We are offering parents or carers the opportunity to complete the Transfer Form in school. An interview date and time will be sent home to you during the week 13<sup>th</sup> January. However, this meeting is not compulsory and if you wish to complete the Transfer Form at home yourself please let Mrs Lopez or Miss Hamilton know and we will arrange for a Form to be sent home on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> January.

As a reminder to all parents all pupils are expected to be in their line for 8.55am so that teaching and learning can start at 9.00am. Persistent lateness means pupils miss out on important routines and this disrupts the smooth running of the school. Pupils are welcome to enter the school grounds from 8.40am when a member of staff will be on duty.

#### School Uniform

Thank you to everyone who observes our School Uniform Policy so carefully. Our boys and girls look smart when they are dressed in the appropriate uniform- this demonstrates a sense of pride and belonging to St Brigid's Primary School. As a reminder, children **must not wear trainers** to school as part of their uniform, both boys and girls must wear black shoes only. Trainers may only be worn as part of a sports activity.

Please remember to label all parts of school uniform.

#### **Raising a Concern or Query**

We recognise that from time to time, a parent or carer may have a concern about some aspect of their child's life at school. By working in partnership with home, it is the school's aim that any concern is dealt with quickly and efficiently as the needs of our pupils are paramount.

Make an appointment with the class teacher to discuss the matter. We strongly advocate making an appointment as otherwise this impinges on teaching and preparation time. (Making an appointment will enable the teacher to give you the necessary time to listen to your concern).

If concerns still remain, the issue can be referred to the Principal. Ultimately if the issue is still not resolved the parents carers can write to the Chairperson of the Complaints Committee of Board of Governors (Mr B Smyth). Unresolved complaints may be referred in writing to the Ombudsman.
